

# La Governor's Table des Gouverneurs

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## Chair's Message

The end of 2008 is almost upon us. It is a time of celebration for many and I believe a time of reflection for all. It has been a busy year for the Board and there have been a number of far-reaching and important decisions made and actions taken by your Governing Board.

The ongoing meetings with education institutions offering OHS&E programs prior to Board meetings is continuing and, as a result of these ongoing discussions, John Sammut, Chair, and Peter Sturm, Vice Chair of the Qualifications Review Committee have been tasked with exploring the possibility of the BCRSP hosting a National Education Symposium in 2009 on college/university OHS&E curriculums.

The Governors approved an important change to the Board's Expense Policy that, effective January 1, 2009, will cover travel and accommodation costs for Governing Board meeting attendance. This change may have contributed to the record number of candidates (17) who stood for election/re-election for the 2009-2010

Board. Two (2) serving Governors were re-elected, Ron Durdle, Department of National Defence, Victoria, BC and Dave Turner, Turner Safety Systems Ltd., Maple Creek, SK. Three incumbent Governors were not re-elected, Paul Andre, Pulp and Paper Health and Safety Association of Ontario, North Bay, ON; John Sammut, Construction Safety Association of Ontario, Toronto, ON; and, Kenneth G. Wilkes, Deep Foundations Contractors Inc., Oshawa ON. Three new Governors will join the Board in January 2009, Mulford Clark, Syncrude Canada Ltd., Fort McMurray, AB; Kevin Dawson, Newfoundland & Labrador Hydro, St. John's, NL; and, Greg McInnes, Enbridge Pipelines Inc., Edmonton, AB.

At their October meeting in Halifax, NS, the Governors approved amendments to the Certification Maintenance Program effective January 1, 2009. These changes will simplify the process and assist CRSPs in meeting this important requirement of their certification maintenance. (see page 5)

In an effort to both promote the BCRSP and to ensure we remain informed of the changing world of OHS&E certification, the Board is a member of the National Organization for Competency Assurance (NOCA), the Canadian Network of National Associations of Regulators (CNNAR)

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and the International Network of Safety and Health Practitioner Organizations (INSHPO). In November, the BCRSP was represented at the NOCA conference by Heather Harvey and at the CNNAR conference by Michael Salib (Past Chair).

The number of CRSPs continues to grow. The Board has certified more than 3500 individuals since 1976 and there are, at present, approximately 2600 active certificate holders. In 2008 there were 337 new CRSP's who successfully completed the certification process. This represents 70% of the 482 candidates who wrote the CRSPEX this year.

The Board has continued with its Brand Marketing Program to inform potential employers of the importance of hiring a CRSP to manage their OHS&E programs. To support these efforts the Board is planning to increase its participation in conferences and similar events including exhibiting at a maximum of six events in 2009.

The 2009 Board meetings are scheduled for Ottawa (February 20-22), Calgary (June 26-28) and Montreal (October 23-25). The Annual General Meeting will be in Calgary, Friday, June 26. Please note these dates in your calendars and plan to attend the Meet and Greet Receptions held in conjunction with these meetings and/or the Governing Board meeting on the respective Sunday mornings.

It has been an honour serving as the Chair of the Governing Board for the past year. It is not a responsibility that I take lightly nor do the other Officers, Governors or the Executive Director. I believe that I am safe in stating, on behalf of the Board, that we will continue to make well thought-out decisions that will further solidify the position of the CRSP as the premier certification for OHS&E professionals in Canada and a desired certification in the realm of international safety.

On behalf of the Executive, the Governing Board and the Executive Director, I would like to wish all certificate holders, their spouses, partners, significant others and families all

the best for the Holiday Season. May you enjoy the company of family and friends during whatever religious or cultural events are a part of your lives. May you have the time to reflect on the events of 2008 and find renewed energy to tackle the challenges that 2009 is sure to bring to us all.

On a more personal note, on behalf of myself, my spouse and my family, I wish the Executive, the Governors, the Executive Director and all certificate holders, the very best for the remainder of 2008 and a Happy, Healthy and Prosperous 2009.

## Mot du président

L'année 2008 tire bientôt à sa fin. Pour de nombreuses personnes, cette période est un moment de célébration et aussi, je crois, une occasion de réflexion pour tous. Cette dernière année a été fort chargée pour le Conseil des Gouverneurs, car de nouvelles décisions et mesures ambitieuses et importantes ont été prises.

Des réunions organisées avec les établissements d'enseignement offrant des programmes de SSE ont eu lieu avant les réunions du Conseil et se poursuivent. À la suite de ces rencontres, John Sammut, président, et Peter Sturm, vice-président du Comité d'évaluation des compétences, ont été mandatés pour explorer la possibilité d'organiser un symposium national sur l'éducation par le CCPSA en 2009. Ce symposium porterait sur les programmes d'études en SSE offerts dans les établissements collégiaux et universitaires.

Les administrateurs ont approuvé une modification importante à la politique concernant les frais du Conseil des Gouverneurs. Celle-ci couvrira dorénavant les frais de déplacement et d'hébergement des administrateurs devant participer aux réunions et entrera en vigueur le 1er janvier 2009. On croit que cette modification pourrait avoir contribué au nombre record de personnes (17) ayant manifesté de l'intérêt à poser leur candidature pour siéger au conseil de 2009-2010. Parmi les candidats, deux (2) administrateurs ont été réélus : Ron Durdle (ministère de la Défense nationale, Victoria, C.-B.) et Dave Turner (Turner Safety Systems Ltd., Maple Creek, SK); trois administrateurs en place n'ont

pas été réélus : Paul Andre (Pulp and Paper Health and Safety Association of Ontario, North Bay, ON), John Sammut (Construction Safety Association of Ontario, Toronto, ON) et Kenneth G. Wilkes (Deep Foundations Contractors Inc., Oshawa ON); et trois nouveaux administrateurs se joindront au Conseil en janvier 2009 : Mulford Clark (Syncrude Canada Ltd., Fort McMurray, AB), Kevin Dawson (Newfoundland & Labrador Hydro, St. John's, NL) et Greg McInnes (Enbridge Pipelines Inc., Edmonton, AB).

Lors de la réunion du Conseil en octobre dernier, tenue à Halifax (Nouvelle-Écosse), les administrateurs ont approuvé les modifications au Programme de maintien de la certification, qui entreront en vigueur le 1er janvier 2009. Ces changements permettront de faciliter la démarche et d'aider les CRSP à satisfaire cette exigence importante pour maintenir leur certification. (voir page 5)

Dans le but de faire la promotion de l'organisation et de rester à l'affût des changements dans le monde de la certification en matière de SSE, le CCPSA est membre de la National Organization for Competency Assurance (NOCA), du Réseau canadien des associations nationales d'organismes de réglementation (RCANOR) et de l'International Network of Safety and Health Practitioner Organizations (INSHPO). En novembre, Heather Harvey a représenté le CCPSA au congrès de la NOCA et Michael Salib (président sortant) a représenté l'organisation au congrès du RCANOR.

Le nombre de CRSP continue toujours d'augmenter. Depuis 1976, le CCPSA a octroyé la certification à plus de 3500 professionnels et nous comptons actuellement près de 2600 professionnels en sécurité agréés actifs. En 2008, nous avons octroyé 337 nouvelles certifications aux candidats ayant réussi le processus d'accréditation. Cela représente 70 % des 482 candidats ayant écrit l'examen CRSPEX cette année.

Le Conseil des Gouverneurs a poursuivi son Programme de promotion de la désignation afin d'informer les employeurs de l'importance d'embaucher un professionnel CRSP pour gérer leurs programmes en SSE. Afin d'appuyer ces efforts, le Conseil envisage d'augmenter sa participation aux événements et congrès de domaines connexes, y compris la participation à un maximum de six foires commerciales en 2009.

En 2009, les réunions du Conseil sont prévues à Ottawa (du 20 au 22 février), à Calgary (du 26 au 28 juin) et à Montréal (du 23 au 25 octobre). L'assemblée générale annuelle se tiendra à Calgary le 26 juin 2009. Inscrivez ces dates à votre agenda afin



de pouvoir assister à une réception d'accueil qui a toujours lieu lors de ces rencontres et/ou à la réunion du Conseil des Gouverneurs le dimanche matin.

## Certified Health and Safety Management System Auditor (CHSMSA)

CRSPs conducting oh&s audits as a significant component of their jobs may be interested in a specialty certification. CRSPs are eligible for some exemptions and reduced fees for the Certified Health and Safety Management System Auditor (CHSMSA) program through the Auditing Association of Canada (AAC), formerly the Canadian Environmental Auditing Association (CEAA).

The CHSMSA designation was developed to recognize a level of achievement for those auditing health and safety management systems. The designation is based on the AACs Body of Skills and Knowledge for

Certified Health and Safety Management System Auditors and Qualification Criteria for Certified Health and Safety Management System Auditors.

The criteria for the CHSMSA designation was developed by a committee comprised of health and safety audit professionals representing a variety of health and safety auditing perspectives to ensure applicants have the required competence to undertake audits. Requirements are set in the areas of education, work experience, formal training and most importantly, demonstrated, appropriate audit experience in the field of health and safety management system auditing.

Of those already granted the CHSMSA designation, a number are CRSPs. The AAC noted a strong correlation between applicants who are CRSPs and their ability to be successful in meeting the CHSMSA certification criteria.

Halifax, NS (October 26, 2008)

- Barbara Nytko was welcomed to her first meeting as the Public Member.
- The BCRSP is now a member of the International Network of Safety & Health Practitioners Organisations (INSHPO).
- 2009 Governing Board meetings are scheduled for Ottawa, ON, February 20-22; Calgary, AB, June 26-28 and Montreal, QC, October 23-25.
- Edmonton and Calgary Item Writing Workshops facilitated by Assessment Strategies Inc., the Board's examination consultants, were offered in September.
- Representatives from the College of the North Atlantic, Dalhousie University, the University of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia Community College and Don Sayers & Associates met with representatives of the Board to provide information on their ohs&e programs.
- Consideration is being given to hosting a National Education Symposium for Canadian colleges/universities offering ohs&e programs.
- Revisions to the Certification Maintenance Program were approved and will be effective as of January 1, 2009.
- Revisions to the Management System manual were approved.
- The 2009 Brand Marketing Program will focus on exhibiting at both ohs&e and sector-specific conferences.
- Approval was given to extending the terms of Governors from two to three years beginning with the 2009 election for the 2010-2011 Board.
- Revisions to the 2008-2009 Strategic Plan were approved.
- The management contract with Fletcher Wright Associates Inc through December 31, 2011 was signed.
